## Wildlife

The Chobe region is one of Africa's richest wildlife areas, with high concentrations of:

- **Elephants:** Known for its large herds, Chobe is home to one of Africa's largest elephant populations. They're frequently seen around waterholes, especially during the dry season.
- **Big Cats:** Lions, leopards, and even cheetahs roam the plains, especially near the river.
- **Buffalo and Antelope:** Buffalo and diverse antelope species like sable and kudu are common sightings.
- **Birdlife:** With over 450 species, birdwatchers will enjoy the variety, from colorful bee-eaters to fish eagles and waterbirds.
- **Predators:** African wild dogs and hyenas are seen, especially in the dry season when they come close to water sources.

Whether you're here for the large mammals or the vibrant bird species, Chobe offers a spectacular year-round wildlife experience. The dry season tends to be best for easy sightings, while the wet season brings lush scenery and a chance to see newborn animals.

## Daily Schedule

## Weather

- **Dry season** (Sep-Oct)
- **Rainy season** (Dec-Feb)
- **Cool, mild days in winter;** warm jackets recommended for winter nights

## Packing Tips

### Clothing

- **Light, Breathable Layers:** Temperatures can vary, so pack light, neutral-colored clothing for daytime safaris, which helps keep you cool and blends in with the environment.
- **Warm Jackets and Layers:** For early mornings and evenings, especially in winter, pack a warm jacket, gloves, and a beanie to stay comfortable.
- **Sun Protection:** A wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen are essential, as the African sun can be intense, even in the cooler months.

### Safari Essentials

- **Binoculars:** Crucial for spotting animals and birds at a distance, especially in wide-open areas.

- **Camera Gear:** A good camera or smartphone with a zoom feature to capture wildlife moments.
- **Small Backpack:** Ideal for carrying your essentials on game drives—water, snacks, and personal items.

### Health & Comfort

- **Insect Repellent:** Especially useful during the wet season when mosquitoes are more prevalent.
- **Malaria Medication:** It's advised to consult your doctor on malaria prevention before visiting.
- **Water Bottle:** Staying hydrated is essential, especially in the warm months.
